#### **Budget Building Process**

- 1. Guiding principles and priorities
  - Ensure long-term financial viability of the City and sustainability of services and programs;
  - Optimize external funding opportunities, in addition to federal and provincial grants, to support infrastructure improvements;
  - Ensure that, whenever possible, the City leverage internal funding sources for capital investment projects in order reduce the cost of debt service.

- 3. Adoption of capital investment budget



#### **Investment Priorities for 2018**


- Sleeving of water pipes & improvements to the sewer systems (TECQ grant)
- Road resurfacing and sidewalk repair projects
- Traffic lights Cavendish corridor
- Professional services for renovations at Kirwan Park and LED street lights
- Investment in small parks and public spaces
- Replenishment of Public Works aging vehicle fleet
- Renovation of the municipal outdoor swimming pool (fall 2018)



### Roads and Traffic \$1.33M

- Road Resurfacing
  - Planned streets:
    - Emerson
    - Smart (Mackle to Mather)
- Sidewalk Repairs
  - Various locations
  - Approximately 7,200m of sidewalk replaced in past 3 years
- Traffic Lights Cavendish corridor
  - Replacement of traffic sensors





### Water and Sewer Infrastructure \$1.345M

- Most financed by TECQ (Gas Tax Grants)
- Includes funds allocated from 2017 Capital Investment Budget
- Water main sleeving began in CSL in 2007
- Sewer sleeving first time being done in 2018
- Water meters for ICI (Industrial, Commercial & Institutional) buildings


